

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Top visual indicators of illness/anomaly in pigs





HEAD



Healthy pig

• Healthy Pig:

• Holds head straight and alert


- Sick pig:
 - Holds head down or drooped/sad looking
 - May hide in the back of pen
 - Any signs of inflammation, injuries, abscesses
 - Any signs of neurological issues (head tilting or frequent shaking)

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EARS





Healthy Pig:

• Ears are alert and pointed up or forward

 No swelling, parasites, frequent shaking, or injury due to environment or pen conditions


- Sick Pig:
 - Swollen ears
 - Injuries (abscesses, open wounds, etc.)
 - Necrotic (dead) tissue


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


EYES









- Healthy Pig:
 - Bright, open eyes with pink eyelids
- Sick Pigs:
 - Dull, sunken, cloudy, twitching or irritated eyes
 - Excessive redness in the eyes, inflammation, discharge, loss of hair and might lack color around the eyes
 - White or yellow (purulent) eye discharge is often observed when respiratory challenges are present, stains from the tear duct







SNOUT











- **Healthy Pig**
 - Straight snout, no deviation to either side
 - Cool to the touch, free of discharge, moist
- Sick Pig
 - Lesions or blisters
 - Abnormal discharge




FRONT LEG/JOINT









Healthy Pig:

Legs appear taut and slender

 Free of inflammation (red and warm to the touch), wounds or swelling

- Sick Pig:
 - Swollen joints
 - Blisters, ulcerations on top of hoof
 - Open sores, hoof cracks, lesions
 - Abnormal walking, limping, toe tapping, reluctance to stand or move






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BODY/CHEST



SICK PIG



Visible spine and shoulders

Visible ribcage and sunken in flank

- Healthy Pig:
 - · Rounded, full belly, well hydrated
- Sick Pig:
 - Visible spine, shoulder blades or ribcage due to malnutrition
 - Sunken in flank (belly looks empty)
 - Labored or abnormal breathing (thumping)








BODY/BELLY





Flank lesion



- Healthy Pig:
 - Rounded, full belly, well hydrated
- Sick Pig:
 - Sunken in flank (belly looks empty)
 - Disproportioned hanging or swollen belly
 - Umbilical hernias (swollen navel under belly)
 - Flank lesions if excessive (infected, large, not healing)
 - Labored or abnormal breathing (thumping)

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SKIN











- Clear skin
- Sick Pig:
 - Pale skin or anemic pigs
 - Raised skin lesions, a greasy appearance, or bruising
 - Scaly, reddened or yellow skin
 - Raised areas of skin or cracks (due to irritation) that are open and susceptible to bacterial infection
 - Bumps, sores, necrosis, vesicles (clear blisters)





HAIR/COAT









- Healthy Pig:
 - Smooth, clean, flat and uniform hair coat
- Sick Pig:
 - Fuzzy hair coat
 - Bald patches, rough/dull/uneven coat


REAR LEG/JOINT





Inflamed joint

Swollen joints



- Healthy Pig:
 - Free moving, normal walking, free of inflammation
- Sick Pig:
 - Swollen joints
 - Blisters, ulcerations on top of hoof
 - Open sores, hoof cracks, lesions can lead to infection
 - Abnormal walking, limping, reluctance to stand or move


TAIL/ANUS





Red mucosa from anus

Bleeding and necrosis







- Tail is clean, free of injuries or tail bites
- Sick Pig:
 - Redness, bleeding, necrosis (dead tissue) or any injury
 - This can trigger tail biting
 - Red colored mucosa of the rectum from the anus
 - This is prone to infections




VULVA/TESTES










- Healthy Pig:
 - Vulva is shade of surrounding skin or similar
 - Free of swelling and excessive redness
- Sick Pig:
 - Castrated market hogs should not have testicles
 - Abnormal mass in perineal area might lead to scrotal hernia

DOWNER PIGS










- Watch for pigs huddling or shivering
- Fallen down pigs are often isolated from other pigs lying on the belly with drooping ears
- These pigs might look dirtier, since their sick behavior makes them vulnerable



ABNORMAL POSTURES








- Watch for pigs with abnormal postures, like dog sitting, with labored breathing thumping or coughing
 - Sitting like a dog might indicate rear joint issues
- Arching the back or dropping the tail might indicate abdominal pain
 - Check for diarrhea in the pen
